Extract of General Regulations, Art. 174



In cases of offences mentioned in G.R's paragraphs 6.2 (abuse of horses), 6.3 (incorrect behaviour) above and Driving Rules Art 926, which are of a less serious nature, the President of the Ground Jury, The Technical Delegate or The Steward, if appointed under Art 908, may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card, either by hand or by any other suitable means, instead of the procedures foreseen in the Legal System. The acceptance of a Warning Card suspends any penalty until new offences take place.

The Person Responsible may or may not accept the Warning Card. If the Person Responsible does not accept a Card which was delivered or presented during or after the Event, the Event Officials may take any action within their capacities deemed necessary and shall report the case to the BHDTA Council. Should the same Person Responsible receive one more Warning Card at the same or any other National Event within one year of the delivery of the first card, the Person Responsible shall be reported to the BHDTA Council for their consideration, under Annex 23 of the BHDTA Rulebook.

Where a Warning Card has been accepted, the offence for which it was delivered shall be taken into consideration when deciding the penalty to be imposed for a similar offence committed within the next twenty-four months.
